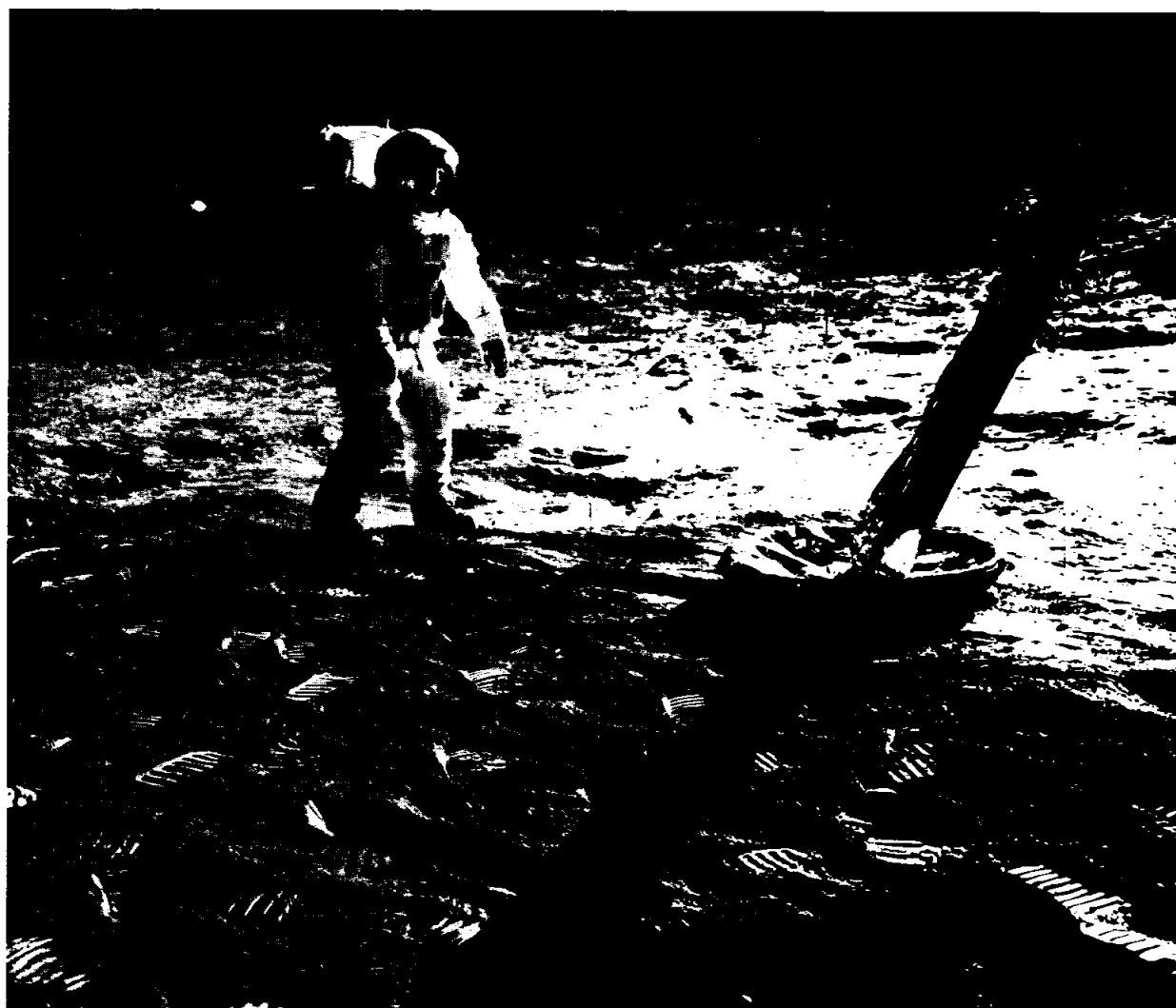

***It happened three years ago -- July 20, 1969***



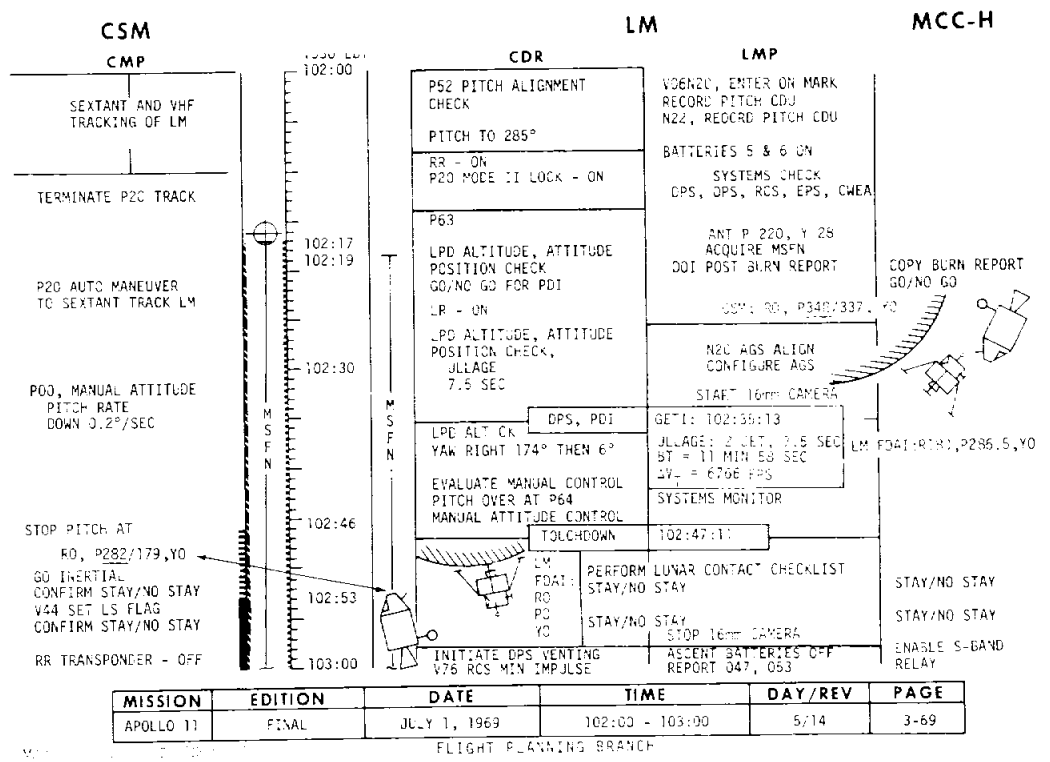
The goal of landing men on the Moon and returning them safely to Earth had been set eight years earlier. Two Apollo missions went out to the Moon as forerunners of the July 20, 1969 landing at Tranquility Base by Apollo 11's lunar module Eagle. The rest is history. Americans would land on the Moon four more times during the next three years with the final landing scheduled in December 1972. Almost a half million people—from space suit seamstresses to welders of exotic metals—in the government-industry team made possible the goal's achievement.



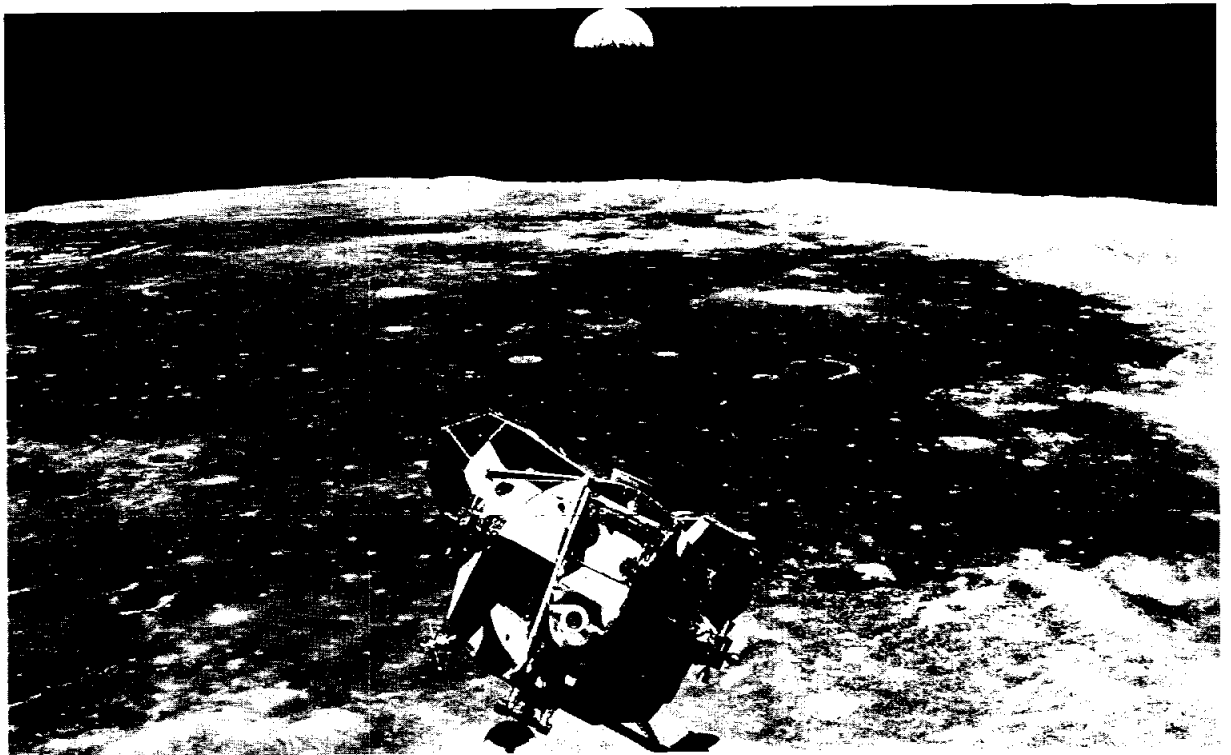
"Houston, Tranquility Base here. The Eagle has landed."

Neil Armstrong's calm report broke the tension in Mission Control. CapCom Charlie Duke answered Armstrong: "Roger, Tranquility. We copy you on the ground. You've got a bunch of guys about to turn blue. We're breathing again."

Thus began the first visit by humans to another celestial body. Armstrong and Edwin "Buzz" Aldrin would spend two and a half hours exploring the Eagle's landing site, gathering samples and erecting an automatic scientific station before rejoining command module pilot Mike Collins in lunar orbit. "We came in peace for all mankind," said a plaque bolted to one of Eagle's talons. Others would visit the Moon, but Apollo 11 was first.

to be greeted by a proud nation.
