ATTACH IDENTIFICATION TAGS TO CAR FRONT

A number of employees who have obtained the new aluminum and black NACA identification tags for their personal vehicles have failed to attach them on the front of their cars.

Military officials have reported recently that some employees are carrying tags in their glove compartments, on the front seat, or stuck up against the windshield. These practices slow up traffic considerably, especially during peak periods when a line of cars must be stopped in order for a military policeman to check if an individual has a tag.

Military authorities request that the identification tag be centered above and attached to the forward side of the front state license plate of the vehicle for which it is issued, whenever possible. The new tag will fit the two inner slots at the top of the Virginia State tag. The NACA tag must be placed on the front of a car, preferably attached to a state tag as instructed.

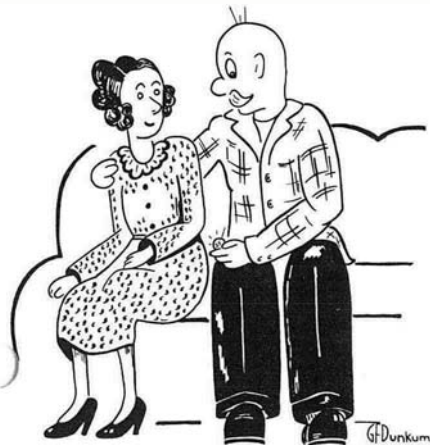
